

Shave Biopsy Wound Care Instructions

- * Keep your wound clean, moist, and covered (no scabs) for better healing *
 - 1. Leave the bandage we have applied to the site in place for 24 hours.
 - Once a day, clean the area with mild soap and water. The shower is a good place to do this. Avoid soaking in baths until you are healed. If you exercise or get sweaty, you may need to cleanse and bandage twice a day. Otherwise, once is fine.
 - 3. Then, apply antibiotic ointment (Bacitracin or Polysporin -if you're not allergic to it). If you are allergic to antibiotic ointment, apply Aquaphor healing ointment or plain petroleum jelly to the site. Cover with a band aid. You can make your own custom bandage with Telfa-type nonstick gauze and paper tape. Paper tape is usually less irritating than other adhesives.
 - 4. Do NOT allow the site to "dry out" or scab over. This will increase your risk of scarring.
- 5. This process should be done 1-2 times a day until healed. (If you take aspirin regularly, once a day would be best).
- 6. You may experience minor amounts of bleeding during wound care. This is normal. Hold a clean cloth or gauze pad to the site for a few minutes if this occurs.
- 7. Your tissue specimen will be submitted to a pathologist and you will receive a separate bill from the pathologist for processing.
